New Classes Begin in June

St. Marys 101 is a program designed to educate the community about city government. If you want to learn more about how the City of St. Marys works, who is responsible for what, and what steps you can take to make a difference, sign up for St. Marys 101. The goals of the program are:

- To increase the number of informed and involved citizens in the community; and
- To "put a face" on local government, making it more accessible to the community.

Each class consists of six 2½ hour evening sessions focusing on specific areas of government. The sessions are conducted in various city buildings, including the Fire Station, Police Department, City Hall, Scrubby Bluff Treatment Plant and the Ward T. Hernandez Economic Development Building. We ask that participants commit to all six classes. At the end of all six classes participants will receive a Graduation Certificate at the first Council Meeting in December. Classes begin in June 2010.
